**“JOHN PRISSEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP”**

**Biographical Information:**

John was born on October 5, 1955, in Eau Claire, Wisconsin. He graduated from Durand High School in 1973. He moved to Fall Creek in October of 1976. His wife Pat and sons Matthew and Mark all graduated from Fall Creek High School. He worked for Tri-State Breeders/Accelerated Genetics as an AI technician for 35 years. John enjoyed fishing, hunting, collecting toy trucks, maintaining a beautiful yard, and gardening. In March 2010, while driving to Florida, John suffered an unexpected and tragic stroke that led to his death. He was a supporter of the Fall Creek community, school system, and athletic teams.

**Qualification Criteria:**

1. Applicant must be a graduating senior attending Fall Creek High School.
2. Student must have completed at least one course in Agriculture or Technology Education.
3. Applicant must have completed at least one Social Studies elective course.
4. Applicants must have lettered in two sports while in high school.
5. The recipient must be planning to attend any accredited college, university, or technical college.

**Scholarship Payment:**

1. Scholarship checks will be made payable to the **recipient and school** by the Treasurer of the Fall Creek Area Foundation and mailed to the recipient's home or current address.
2. The recipient must provide grade transcripts to the Foundation Treasurer as proof of successful completion of each semester's course of study prior to payment.
3. Payment schedule is as follows:
  - One-half to be paid after the completion of the first academic semester upon receipt of evidence that the student has maintained a "B" (3.0) average for the first semester and has registered for the upcoming semester.
  - Second-half to be paid after the completion of the second academic semester upon the receipt of evidence that the student has maintained a "B" (3.0) average for the first academic year and has registered to continue for the next academic year.
